

Inexhaustible Creativity in the Jaenisch


It used to be regarded as a surprise weapon, but over the last 10 to 15 years the attention given to the Jaenisch Gambit at the highest level has significantly lifted its status to a weapon of great creativity and resilience; one that makes Black's winning chances quite realistic, even against well-prepared opponents. It now is the third most popular variation of the Ruy Lopez (after 3...a6 and 3...♜f6), with a very respectable score of 53 per cent.

More than a few top grandmasters (Radjabov, Aronian, Ivanchuk, Andreikin, and occasionally even Carlsen) at some point had or still have the Jaenisch in their repertoire, and they have done much to elevate its status, whilst other strong grandmasters (notably Azarov, Nisipeanu, Zviagintsev, Cmilyte, Nybäck, Ivanisevic, Salem and Pruijssers) have repeatedly shown what a formidable weapon the gambit can be.

Moreover, by devoting one third of his book *The Ruy Lopez Revisited* (New In Chess, 2009) to the Jaenisch, Ivan Sokolov no doubt greatly boosted its popularity... as well as its credibility. And finally, mention should be made of Sergey Tiviakov's article in Yearbook 104 of 2012 ('A Great Comeback for the Jaenisch'), which gives an inspiring overview of recent developments in the variation 4. ♜c3 fxe4 5. ♜xe4 ♜f6 6. ♜xf6+ ♛xf6.

This article will attempt to show that there is still no end to the creativity and resilience of the Jaenisch Gambit as it continues to be played at all levels, but also that the amount of 'theory' is developing rapidly, thanks to efforts by both black and white players.

A remarkable demonstration of this innovative potential has been offered by the Belgian International Master Jozef ('Jef') Boey, who is rightly considered one of the pioneers of the Jaenisch. Jef Boey, who played first or second board for Belgium in seven Olympiads, became an International Master in 1966, at a time when the world counted just over 100 active grandmasters. Moreover, in 1978 he acquired the title of grandmaster in correspondence chess which, as a result of professional and family commitments, had by then become his main chess discipline. For several decades, Jef belonged to the world top of postal chess, as shown, for example, by his 2nd place in the

7th World Championship 1975-78, behind Estrin.

Although Jef put an end to his tournament practice in 2008 for health reasons and despite his advanced age of 81 years, he is fervently continuing his lifelong commitment to the Jaenisch Gambit. As a result, he boasts what might well be the most complete database on the gambit... containing over 100,000 games and analyses. And it goes without saying that, in the process, he continued to develop new and very exciting ideas, some of which are featured here.

The Game Selection below starts off with three pioneering games by Jef Boey – one of which was played only last year! They set the scene for the powerful strategic ideas which characterize the Jaenisch, and which are often based on an early initiative and ample space for

Black. The pawn sacrifice, which is typical for several important variations in the Jaenisch, definitely remains a powerful lever.

In the theory section, we will focus on four main variations.

The Former Main Line (RL 6.7-14)

5...d5 used to be the main way of treating the Jaenisch, and it has been analysed pretty exhaustively. After 4.♘c3 fxe4 5.♘xe4 d5 6.♘xe5 dxe4 7.♘xc6 ♗g5 (or 7...♗d5, which is rarely played nowadays and may well have been refuted), well-prepared black players continue to do well. However, White is fighting back. This is clearly shown in, for example, the game Maze-Inkiov, since 8.♗e2 ♘f6 9.♘xa7+ has so far been a minor line compared to 9.f4.



The Current Main Line (RL 6.6)
5...♘f6 may now be the main line for Black, and it is clearly enjoying the preference of the grandmasters. It leads to a straightforward pawn sacrifice by Black, giving

him strong compensation in terms of open lines and diagonals. In this Survey, we will mainly consider new games and ideas since Tiviakov's article in Yearbook 104. The emphasis, though, after 6.♘xf6+ ♗xf6 7.♗e2 ♗e7 8.♘xc6, remains on 8...bxc6, as opposed to the 'old' line 8...dxc6.



New Ideas (RL 6.3-5)

In this third section Black avoids taking on e4 and instead goes for either 4...♘f6 or 4...♘d4. These lines may be less popular, but the games and analyses shown here, typically based on Black's space advantage versus White's lag in development, suggest that they still harbour potential for new ideas. Some of Jef Boey's analyses shown in this section are really exciting: his baffling new idea in the famous game Kupreichik-Bellon Lopez of 1984 must be taken particularly seriously, even though engines are really slow to do so!

However, as Ivan Sokolov has already made clear, the main challenge for Black (after 4...♘d4) lies

in finding an adequate response to an early 5.exf5, as opposed to the more 'cooperative' 5.♗a4.

Increasingly Popular: 4.d3 (RL 6.2)

The final section focuses on White's other main way of treating the Jaenisch, starting with 4.d3 instead of 4.♘c3. Initially, the popularity of this variation may have been linked to White's reluctance to enter into extreme variations, often well prepared by Black, after 4.♘c3. The general character of the line with 4.d3 is a little less sharp, though active enough. However, this line has now become very popular even at the highest level, and as the games in this section show, White seems to be making real progress.

Conclusion

The Jaenisch has established itself as a credible 'defence' for Black, but now white players are starting to take it very seriously as well, and they have definitely began to play their part in the process of innovation. At club level, the gambit will continue to provide fun and creativity for many more years or even decades to come, but at IM and GM level, it is clear that careful preparation rather than improvisation is now called for.


Finally, it is interesting to note that engines, particularly in the case of a pawn sacrifice, tend to underestimate Black's compensation. This may be a strong incentive for further innovation in itself!


